Steve Phillips is the founder of Democracy in Color, a political organization dedicated to race, politics and the multicultural progressive New American Majority, and author of the New York Times and Washington Post bestselling Brown Is the New White: How the Demographic Revolution Has Created a New American Majority. He is host of the color-conscious political podcast, "Democracy in Color with Steve Phillips."

Phillips is a national political leader and civil rights lawyer. In 1992 he became the youngest person ever elected to public office in San Francisco and went on to serve as president of the Board of Education. He is co-founder of PowerPAC+, a social justice organization dedicated to building a multiracial political coalition. PowerPAC+ conducted the largest independent voter mobilization effort backing Barack Obama, Cory Booker, and Kamala Harris. In 2014, Phillips co-authored the first-ever audit of Democratic Party spending and was named one of "America's Top 50 Influencers" by *Campaigns and Elections* magazine. In 2016, Democracy in Color organized the first-ever panel on women of color in politics at the Democratic National Convention. In January 2017, Democracy in Color hosted the only DNC chair candidates forum focused on race and diversity.

Phillips has appeared on multiple national radio and television networks including NBC, CNN, MSNBC, Fox News, and TV One. He is a columnist for *The Nation* and a regular opinion contributor to *The New York Times*. He is a graduate of Stanford University and Hastings College of the Law.
